## ParentPay - Message for Year 7 on Monday 4th September.

On this day all students will be set up on our cashless catering system, and will come home with a set-up letter which will enable parents to activate ParentPay and add funds to their child's account. Students will be required to bring a packed lunch until the account is activated and funds are added to the account.

Students (except for Year 7 and 12) will all have experienced their new timetable and teachers for the last 3 weeks of the term and should already understand the routines expected of them.



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## **Uniform and Equipment Expectations**

We believe that an excellent uniform is part of setting high academic standards and encourages students' self-confidence. Upon return to school in September students' uniform should be worn correctly both in and out of school. **Under no circumstances should false nails, false eyelashes or jewellery be worn.** Students will remain in the Inclusion room until the offending item is removed (exceptions are items which are worn for a medical need).

Below is a reminder of uniform expectations:

#### **Girls**

- Black blazer with the school badge
- Pleated plaid skirt (note skirts must not be rolled up) or plain black trousers (must not be boot-cut, skinny legged, tight-fitting, jeans etc.)
- Black socks or black tights
- Plain white shirt with collar (long or short sleeved)
- School tie (that conceals top button)
- Plain black leather shoes (not plimsolls, canvas shoes, trainers, sandals, or
- boots etc.)

#### **Boys**

- Black blazer with the school badge
- Plain black trousers straight legged (must not be boot-cut, skinny legged,
- tight-fitting, jeans etc.)
- Plain white shirt with collar (long or short sleeved) that must be kept tucked in
- School tie (that conceals top button)
- Plain dark socks
- Plain, black, leather shoes (not plimsolls, canvas shoes, trainers, sandals or
- boots etc.)

As part of our ECCO values, we stress the importance of organisation. Students are expected to be ready to learn when they return to school. The following items are the minimum expectation for all students:

- Black or Blue Pen
- Green Pen
- Pencil
- Rubber
- Ruler
